

How to find 'Allied Health Science' courses (of which some are suitable for Medical/Dentistry students interested Study Abroad Trimesters)

Use the official website and filter courses using parameters such as “Gold Coast”, “UG”, “Trimester1” and “allied health science”? [Griffith University Courses](#)

Important:

1. Practicum is not open to SA students such as [Pharmacy Practice III - 3008PHM \(griffith.edu.au\)](#);
2. If it says “Restricted” on the course page then they are not open to SA students such as [Contributing to the Community - 4313AHS \(griffith.edu.au\)](#);
3. Students needs to meet the published prerequisites.
4. 6000 Level courses are Honours Level courses therefore not open to 1st-3rd year UG students.
5. 7000 level courses are PG level courses. UG students are not eligible for 7000 level courses.
